Constant rainfall means the landscape is lush and fertile (in fact, many of the best farm country can be found near here), while the mild summers make the Lake District the perfect vacation destination for UK residents and international tourists alike. Summertime temperatures typically waver between the upper 70s and lower 60s (F), while wintertime temperatures stay in the mid 30s.
